
Pond Liner



Installation Guide for Liners Over 100m²




Step 1

The shape and dimensions of the excavation will determine whether the liner is to be placed on the short or long edge prior to unrolling. Dimensions of the liner are included on the packaging. Place the liner in accordance with the dimensions of the excavation.




Step 2

Unroll the liner along the edge of the excavation as per the diagram. Note: For this example the liner is being unrolled along the long edge. Depending on where the packaged liner is placed, it may need to be unrolled along the short edge.




Step 3

Unroll the liner towards the opposite side of the excavation to expose a section of the liner sufficient enough to cover the trench.




Step 4

Anchor the section of liner over the trench. This can be done by standing multiple people on it, or placing heavy objects. This step allows the rest of the liner to be unfolded without falling into the excavation.




Step 5

With at least two people on each corner of the liner, evenly walk it out towards the opposite edge. Once the liner is completely unrolled, ensure it is placed evenly over the excavation.



Step 6

Let the liner settle into the excavation. The liner may need to be adjusted to fit evenly. On the anchored side of the liner, backfill the trench and chase out any large folds to the corners of the excavation (not always possible).



Step 7

Backfill all trenches lightly. Sufficient enough to hold the liner in place, while also allowing the liner to move when getting filled with water. After backfilling the trenches, the excavation is ready to be filled with water. Once filled, other necessary groundwork and landscaping can be completed. Note: Do not trim any of the edges of the liner until after the pond has been completely filled with water as additional movement of the liner may occur.
